Residence Hall Guest Policies for Homecoming and Siblings Weekend

As your Redbird prepares for Homecoming and Siblings Weekend (spring semester), University Housing Services (UHS) wants to remind families of our guest guidelines, especially for minors visiting campus. All guests must be registered at the front desk upon arrival, present a valid government-issued Photo ID, and be escorted by their student host at all times. Residents must also have roommate consent before hosting.

During normal operations, guests under the age of 13 are not permitted in residence halls unless accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, and guest ages 13-17 are permitted with parent/guardian permission. However, during special weekends like Homecoming and Siblings Weekend, younger guests are welcome to join in the fun. The Minor Guest Registration Form is always required for anyone under 18 and is required in advance through our Housing and Dining Portal once a resident initiates the request.

Now is the time to prepare for these weekends if you choose to allow your minor to be a registered guest, ensuring they have the proper registration materials outlined above and you communicate with the host to complete the Minor Guest Registration Form.

Registration for spring 2026 classes will begin in mid-October. Students can check their assigned registration date and time by visiting the Student Center in their My.IllinoisState.edu portal.
