Strong Start With Academics

Encourage your student to stay on top of their course content by attending class, regularly checking Canvas and other online course resources, visiting instructors' office hours, reading their Illinois State email, and seeking academic assistance. If students need help, many free academic services are available, including Peer Success Advocates, tutoring for many courses, seminars and workshops, writing assistance, and more. Assisting Your Student Navigate an Absence from Class

There are many differences between high school and college in terms of class attendance.

Students in college are expected to meet the attendance expectations set individually by each instructor. Instructors include their attendance expectations in their course syllabi and/or on their Canvas sites.

Unlike in high school, where parents, guardians, or students may have reported absences to a central office, Illinois State does not require centralized reporting of absences unless the student is requesting to be excused under a University policy.

University policies override instructor-specific expectations **only** for these student absence reasons: (1) bereavement due to the loss of a family member, (2) military duty or training obligations, or (3) isolation/quarantine that is mandated in writing by a health official. To utilize one of these excused absences policies, your student can complete the <u>Absence Reporting form</u> or contact the Dean of Students Office at (309) 438-2008.

Accommodation requests for religious obligations can be submitted to Student Access and Accommodation Services. If granted, these accommodation requests may also result in university-approved absences. The Athletics department helps NCAA athletes manage absences that are required to attend athletics competitions/meets/games.

The Dean of Students Office can issue <u>courtesy absence notifications</u> to instructors to assist students who would otherwise not be able to contact all their instructors in a timely fashion themselves (e.g., due to hospitalization or significant health or family matters). However, the Dean of Students Office <u>does not</u> have the authority to determine what absence is or is not excused. Students are expected to meet the attendance expectations set individually by each instructor and/or seek clarification from their instructors about whether a certain absence is excused.
